Module objectives/intended learning outcomes	<i>The purpose of the module:</i> <i>The purpose of mastering the module "Russian language" is to develop the skills and abilities of oral and written business communication in current situations in students of a technical university. The task for mastering the module is the language material of the program designed to enable students to actively engage in the educational process: perceive educational information by ear, be able to take notes, reproduce the information read in a logical sequence, communicate in social, everyday, educational, professional and cultural spheres.</i> <i>Requirements for the level of mastering the course content.</i> <i>This discipline helps to develop the following competencies:</i> <i>– professional: possession of basic skills in creating various types of texts based on standard methods and current regulations;</i> <i>– academic: knowledge of the lexical and grammatical structure, richness and norms of the Russian literary language and its scientific sub-style;</i> <i>– social and personal: possession of communicative skills and norms of Russian speech etiquette in various areas of communication in an interdisciplinary and international environment.</i> <i>As a result of studying the course, the student should know:</i> <i>– the main features of the phonetic and graphic system of the Russian language, the place of stress in common words, transcription signs and intonation markings, rules for the intonation design of statements;</i> <i>– common and professional vocabulary;</i> <i>– the specifics of speech styles of the Russian language, their linguistic design.</i> <i>To be able to read:</i> <i>– fully and accurately understand the information contained in the text at a reading speed of at least 60 words/min.;</i> <i>– briefly convey the idea and main content of the perceived information.</i> <i>In listening:</i> <i>– listen to and understand the information of an oral message presented at a normal pace, from the educational and professional sphere, followed by conveying its content with</i>

	varying degrees of condensation. <i>In speaking:</i> – create your own text (description, narration, explanation, reasoning), defining the concept and program of the statement, observing the logical sequence, using adequately linguistic means. <i>In writing:</i> – compose a written statement of a reproductive-productive nature with a gradual increase in volume (monologue-description, narration, explanation, reasoning), defining the program of the statement, choosing the appropriate linguistic means and observing the necessary rules for the design of a written statement in accordance with the proposed topic and communicative setting.
